PREPARATION FOR A SEXUAL SIN CONFESSION

"Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its evil desires. Do not offer the parts of your body to sin, as instruments of wickedness, but rather offer yourselves to God, as those who have been brought from death to life; and offer the parts of your body to him as instruments of righteousness." Rom. 6:12,13

The following pages will help you create a list of ways you have sinned through your motivations, thinking, behaviors, and pursuit of selfish goals. You may highlight the sins that apply to you or rewrite them on another sheet of paper.

| Defining sin: "Lord, forgive me for <i>touching Jim's genitals</i> and permitting, (or encouraging) him to <i>touch my breasts and genitals</i> ." |
| Euphemism: "Lord, forgive me for having an affair with Joanne." |
